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Description of DCE Site

Ballet for All Kids, Agoura Hills California

- Non-profit organization that provides inclusive classical ballet classes to children of all abilities
- Utilizes *Schlachte* method that encompasses various learning styles
- Volunteer program allows youth individuals to assist ballet students of various disabilities

Needs Assessment

- Redevelopment of volunteer program
- Development of volunteer training program
- Recruit more volunteers

Literature Review

- Effective coaching for non-OT individuals working with vulnerable populations requires utilization of therapeutic modes and interpersonal reasoning skills (Wong et al., 2020).
- Responding to children with behavioral challenges requires knowledge of why the child may be exhibiting behaviors and understanding one's own self-regulation (Hui et al., 2016).
- Children with disabilities cannot be treated with only one approach as they require a multimodal approach due to their complex needs (Ismael et al., 2018; Case-Smith et al., 2013).
- Providing learning materials, quizzes, video modules ahead of time can improve instructional teaching and maximize educational opportunities to students (Malik et al., 2017)

Learning Objectives

By the end of DCE, the doctorate student has:

- Implemented various occupational therapy frames of references and models of practices to develop a volunteer training manual to guide teaching non-OT individuals.
- Designed and implemented the volunteer training program.
- Recruited volunteers and measured the effectiveness of the volunteer training program.

Program Description and Implementation

Inclusion Criteria:

- Applied and was accepted into the volunteer program as a new volunteer OR
- Current or former volunteers for the DCE site OR
- Interest of applying for the volunteer program in the future
- Physical and mental capacity to complete the volunteer training and volunteer program

- 7 Current Volunteers and 2 Former Volunteers of DCE site
- 1 Volunteer with Special Needs
- 4 Potential Volunteers

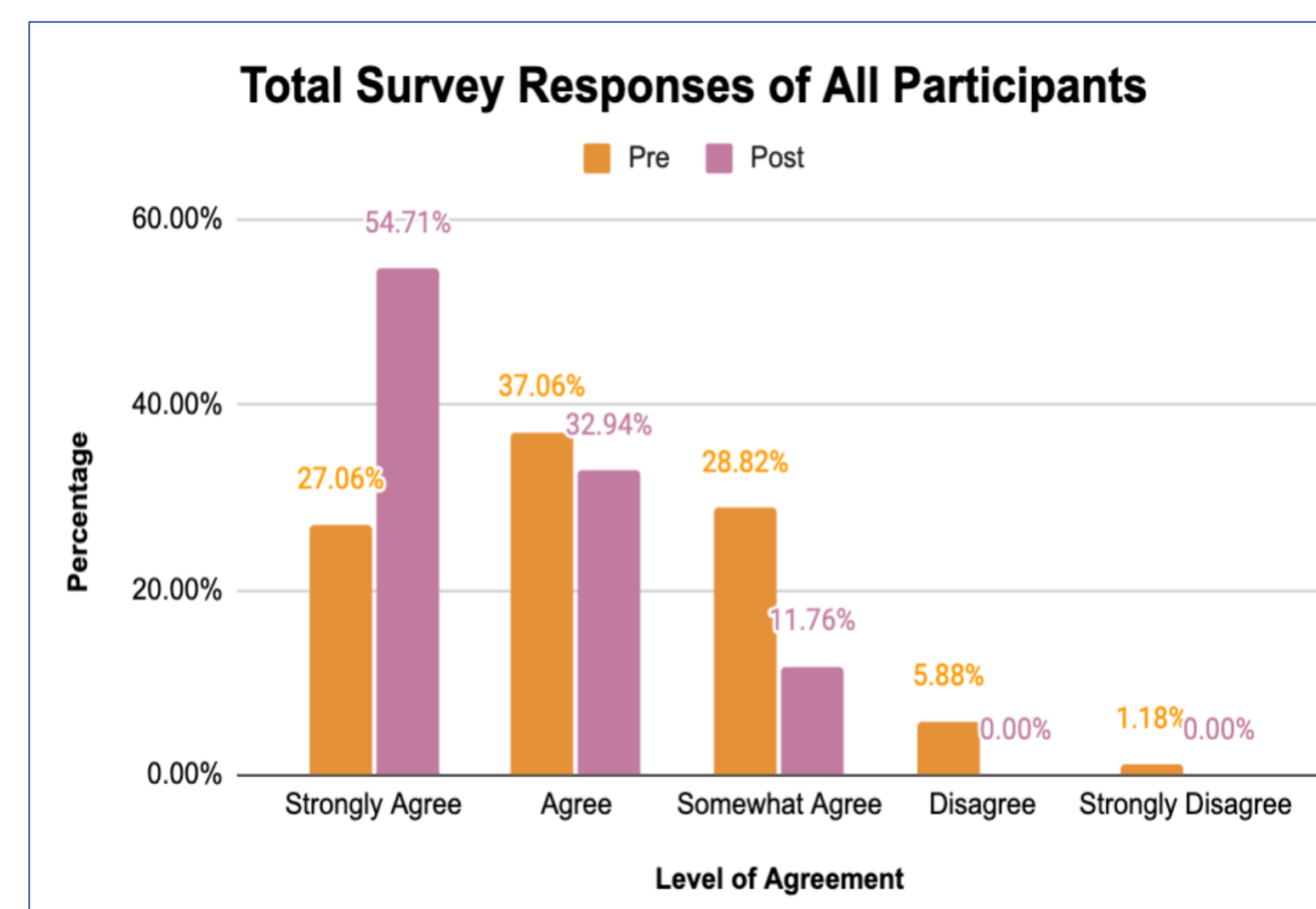
Volunteer Training Session Topics

- Session 1:** HIPAA compliance, professionalism and communication skills, overview of OT, PT, SLP, ABA therapy disciplines, Sensory Processing Part 1
- Session 2:** Sensory Processing Part 2, Behavior Management & Emotional Regulation Part 1
- Session 3:** Behavior Management and Emotional Regulation Part 2
- Session 4:** Common diagnoses (ASD, ADHD, CP, Down syndrome, epilepsy and seizure disorders)
- Session 5:** Ballet facilitation, prompting, universal precautions (sanitization, COVID-19, safety)

Training Sessions:

- Feb 6-Feb 27, 2022
- Every Sun 1-3pm and Mon Feb 21 1-3pm
- Synchronous, asynchronous or blended learning options

Themes	Examples
Appreciation for various teaching and learning methods	"It was a nice mix of videos, listening to the material, and interactive activities". "Liked how I was able to participate in the program even from being in a different state."
Comprehensive training content	"I liked how we got an exposure to common diagnoses, terminology to describe disorders, examples of kids displaying certain behaviors, and how these disorders would affect a child in realistic situations."
Program intensity	"The two-hour blocks were difficult to manage with my schedule. I would prefer 1-hour blocks and a longer period." "Would like to have more interactive activities and in-person trainings but also understand because of COVID-19."
