

#### Literature Review


- Collaborative care is ideal in order to provide the clients a leading role in care planning, address the diversity within survivors context, and develop standards of care and services (Tsai et al., 2020; Bintliff et al., 2018)
- There is a lack of research regarding survivor reintegration (Schroeder et al., 2024; Ramaj, 2023)
- There is a need for follow-up and social support postcompletion of rehabilitation programs (Schroeder et al., 2024; Tsai et al., 2020)


## Learning Objectives
